Following in Sarsfield's steps for Heritage Week

Sarsfield's Way challenge enticed a small crowd of walkers hailing from Sliabh Eachtaí, Woodford and ClareGalway, not to mention County Mayo, County Clare and further. Local tour guide, Dermot Moran, led the way, imparting folklore, *béaloideas* in Irish, as only a local can do. Locally based archeologist and Irish speaker from Hungary, Tamas Peteravy, shared his knowledge on placenames along the way. Indeed, quite a few of the company shared *béaloideas* of their own, making for plenty of conversation. The group went as far as Ré Rua with it's unique view of Lough Derg, County Tipperary and County Clare.



Bilingual tour of Dunsandle Castle – who's that in the stocks?

Dunsandle Castle attracted an impressive crowd for the free bilingual tour. This is a De Burgo Castle built in the fifteenth century with the help of a £10 'grant' from the English government. The tour guides shared the castle's secrets: the ice house, built in the seventeenth century, which was filled from Lough Rea in winter time; the murder hole behind the main entrance; the anti-clockwise spiral staircase, a rare thing; the groin vault and much more.



Of course, the week ended on a high with families and friends coming out to play for the Bilingual Treasure Hunt on Friday night. It began in earnest with an address by Tamas Peteravy who gave every hint possible at the answers to the treasure hunt clues for those listening. After that the competitors took off on the treasure hunt.
